• Attack on great industrial monopolies, such as the

Sherman Act

Environmental policy, such as national parks

Woodrow Wilson Domestic Policy

- Prohibition of child labour
- Reduction of customs duties, such as Underwood Act
- Introduction of Federal income tax

Woodrow Wilson Foreign Policy and role in WW1

- Initial policy of neutrality
- Wilson's use of Colonel House as President's peace envoy to Europe
- Build-up of American armed forces
- Re-election campaign of 1916
- Characterisation of US intervention in the war as a crusade
- Wilson's 14 Points, especially the League of Nations
- Role of Wilson at Paris Peace negotiations
- Senate's rejection of League of Nations and defeat of Wilson

The passive presidents: Harding, Coolidge and Hoover, 1921–32

- Expansion of credit and consumerism
- Laissez-faire approach to economy by all three Republican presidents
